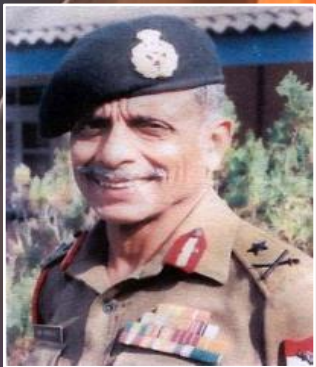

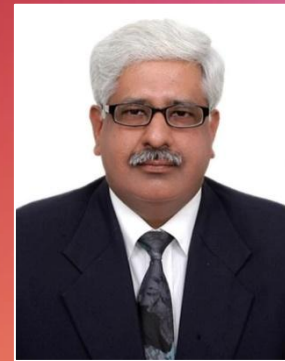

TRANSPORT FEE

- **Tuition Fee:** To be paid monthly as per post-COVID, DOE guidelines.

TRANSPORT FEE

- **Optional Facility:** Provided by the school.
- **Fleet:** 5 school buses + hired 14 buses
- **Private Transport:** Paid annually -11 months upfront.
- **Transport Fee:** Paid **quarterly** in the **first month of each quarter** (e.g. Apr-May-Jun fee to be paid in April).
- **Withdrawal:** Not allowed mid-session. Exceptions for address changes with **one-month prior notice**; otherwise, one month's fee for the quarter applies.

THIRD LANGUAGE POLICY – CLASS VIII

- Introduction of mandatory third language (R3) from Class VI (2026–27)
 - Part of a phased implementation plan
- **No change for present Class VIII Batch (2026–27)**
- **Existing language structure continues for current Class VIII students**



THIRD LANGUAGE POLICY – CLASS VIII

- **Third Language (Sanskrit / German / French):** Continued from VI -- VIII
- **Promotion Requirement:**
 - Passing in the third language in Class VIII is mandatory for promotion.
 - One retest will be allowed to clear the third language.
 - A student who is unable to clear the third language in class VIII, will not be eligible for promotion.

(For Classes VI to VIII)

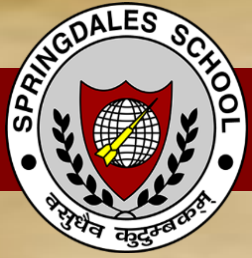
For the holistic development of the students, co-curricular activities in the following areas be carried out by the teachers and will be graded term-wise on a 3-point grading scale:-

PROMOTION POLICY

A student must secure 33 marks out of 100 to pass in a subject(s).



PROMOTION POLICY

If a child fails in the examination of class VIII, he/she shall be given instructions and granted opportunity for Re-Examination.



PROMOTION POLICY

In Re-Examination if a student is not eligible for pass and promotion, he/she will be placed in the category of 'Essential Repeater'.

Essential Repeater will be held back in the same class during the next session.



PROMOTION POLICY

No benefit of **Grace Marks** will be given to a student appearing in Re-Examination for the promotion to the next higher class.
